G. Urner and J. Thomas Jones.

The Committee made the following Report: —

Whereas Our respected and beloved professional
Brother, John S. McCreery has been
removed from among us by Death.

Resolved — That we the Members of the Frederick
Bar have learned of his death with sincere
and earnest sorrow

Resolved — That during his short Professional career among
us, our brother had rendered ~~to~~ himself
dear to us, in no ordinary degree by his talents,
integrity and knowledge — And that we deplore his
death not only as a shock to our personal feelings
but as a loss to the profession of which he was an
