



# IN THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR FREDERICK COUNTY, MARYLAND ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REMOTE HEARING REOUESTS

All requests for remote hearings are to be filed at least thirty (30) days prior to any scheduled hearing. Requests for remote hearing in contested cases will only be granted at the discretion of the Court.

The Court will only consider remote hearing requests filed less than thirty (30) days prior to hearing on an emergency basis.
