100 Years Ago...

The second meeting of the Bar Association of Frederick County was a Special Meeting called by the President, Milton G. Urner, because of the passing of two members F. Marion Fauble, on January 25, 1923, and Baker Johnson, on January 2, 1923. One would have to presume this was a somber meeting, but the minutes point up the similarities of the Bar Association of 1923 and 2023. Note members were appointed to raise money for flowers, appointed draft suitable resolutions to present to the Court at the opening term, and given instructions on attending Mr. Fauble's funeral together.

Frederick, Maryland January 26, 1923

Special meeting of the Bar Association was called to order on the above date by the President, Mr. Urner, who explained that they were asked to meet in special session because of the death of F. Marion Fauble who, at the time of his death, January 25, 1923, was a member of the Frederick County Bar.

Upon motion made and carried the President appointed William M. Storm, George R. Dennis and Sherman P. Bowers as a Committee to canvass the membership of the Bar to solicit funds for the purpose of sending some flowers to the deceased.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the President appoint a committee of three to draft suitable resolutions upon the death of Mr. Fauble to be presented to the Court at the opening of the February Term on February 5th, 1923. Mr. Urner appointed on the committee; - W. Clinton McSherry, Frank L. Stoner and Clayton O. Keedy.

It was decided to attend the funeral of Mr. Fauble in a body and the members were requested to meet at the Court House on Saturday, January 27th, 1923 at 2:15 P.M.

Upon motion made and carried the President was authorized to appoint a committee of three to draft suitable resolutions on the death of Baker Johnson, who was a member of the Frederick County Bar at the time of his death on January 2nd, 1923, to be presented to the Court at the opening of the February Term on February 5th, 1923. Mr. Urner appointed on this committee Jacob Rohrback, H.D. Etchison and Harry C. Hull.

No further business appearing the meeting adourned.
